

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



“Animal Shelter gets second \$20,000 grant”



On October 21, 2008, the Maddie’s Fund Board of Directors awarded a second grant in the amount \$20,000 to the City of Daphne’s Dr. Albert Corte, Jr. Animal Shelter. The grant supports the collection and publication of animal shelter statistics and other activities on behalf of lost, stray, or homeless dogs and cats. The grant affords tremendous flexibility on what the funds can be used for, and the

Daphne Animal Shelter will use this grant to launch a much needed animal shelter website, purchase a new sign for the shelter, host ongoing spay/neuter campaigns, rabies vaccination clinics, microchip clinics, purchase medicine for first shots, replacement of self watering bowls, fencing for animals runs, cat cages for adoption events with multi-levels, advertise upcoming adoption events, purchase a new washer/dryer unit, purchase an enclosed trailer for off-site equipment, table/chairs, and two for one adoptions. The remainder of the funds will be used to provide general shelter improvements, and outreach to the community about the importance in the community of spay & neuter and a variety of other activities.


The first Maddie’s Grant was awarded in August of 2007, and allowed the shelter to purchase a new animal control truck to transport the animals to the rescue mission, veterinarian visits and also aided in the rotating patrol of neighborhoods collecting homeless, lost and stray animals in the city. The grant made it possible for the staff to do their jobs better. It afforded the opportunity to acquire new signage promoting the spay & neuter programs, supplies for pet adoptions, collars for pets during adoptions, flyers and brochures at off-site events & Maddie’s coalition activities, marketing/promotions campaign items, i.e. poster paper, banners and branding logos.



Maddie's Pet Rescue Project of Baldwin County hosted "Love Under the Oaks," a speed-dating pet adoption event on Sunday, February 8th from 3-6 pm. The event was held at the American Legion Post 199 on the bay in Fairhope. Attendees enjoyed food served by the American Legion, music by Roger Fleshman and a meet & greet of local shelter pets "singles!" Eligible (pets) guys and gals, from the Bay Minette, Daphne, Fairhope and Magnolia Springs shelters as well as The Haven.

Summer Time Health and Safety Tips for Your Pet

Summertime temperatures and humidity, parked cars, jogging, beaches, swimming pools and "the wind in your face" can be hazardous to your pet's health.



Leave your pets at home: The temperature inside a car can peak up to a 120 degrees or higher in minutes during the summer months.

Shelter: Dogs & Cats need a cool place to stay in summer temperatures, inside or out. Shade trees will not keep the animals cool enough. Dogs need shelter or a house.

Water: Make sure your pet always has access to cool, clean water. Never give your pet ice water, which can shock the system, and cause severe upsets.

Beach and Pool: Protect your pet’s feet from hot sand or pavement, provide ample shade and hose him down after a salt water swim if you take him to the beach. Chlorinated water irritates your pets eyes, never leave them unattended, once in the pool they cannot get out without your help, and may soon panic and drown.

Ticks and Fleas: Carefully go over your pets body once a week to check for fleas, ear mites and tiny bumps or cuts. Always use a good flea and tick repellent recommended by your veterinarian.

Exercise: Dogs are naturally designed for sprinting, not for uninterrupted running or jogging. During the summer, exercise should be cut back and limited to the cooler, early morning or later evening hours. Their body temperature rises faster than excess heat can be dissipated.

Traveling: Pets riding with their heads out the window are in danger of injury from debris embedding itself in their eyes, nostrils, ear canals and throat. The bed of a pick-up truck can overheat from the sun and reflected roadways or pet could be injured during a rough ride. During braking, an animal can be thrown from the truck onto the road and injured severely if you brake suddenly. So let the pet ride inside with you.



Learn Something New at SEEDS' Summer Lyceum

The 2009 Summer Lyceum presented by SEEDS, Daphne's educational enrichment foundation, is now under way!

Sixteen exciting afternoon and evening classes -- open to all Baldwin County public, private and home school students -- are being offered at various Daphne schools and community settings during June and July.

Virtual tours of the U. S., the United Kingdom and Africa are among this year's offerings as well as short histories of math, dance and sports; introductory Spanish; whimsical portraiture; and a brief study of film as art. Reading, composition, critical thinking, geography, research and computer skills will also be highlighted by SEEDS' outstanding 2009 Summer Lyceum faculty.

Each 10-hour course held over a one-week period is designed to spark new academic and personal interests. Evening classes in Italian cooking and on the history and culture of local jubilees are open to family members, as well.

Tuition ranges from \$50-\$70 for each course. Registration is limited to twenty students per class, and participants are being accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

Village Point Preserve Park

The headstone of Louis D'Olive, D'Olive plantation's patriarch, has been returned to the historic D'Olive family cemetery inside Village Point Park Preserve. Dick Scott and Al Guarisco, Village Point Foundation Board members, worked to restore it and made a concrete collar in which the heavy marble was resealed. Dwayne Coley with the City of Daphne had to bring in heavy equipment to raise the solid marble marker into place. More stones will be returned in the coming year.

The Alabama Coastal Foundation contributed with clearing and plantings of their own in February. While the efforts of the City has primarily been to remove Popcorn Trees, Chinese Privet and Cogongrass along the main road and creek where infestation was concentrated, Alabama Coastal Foundation planted all over the park and one group focused on clearing the path from the Freedom Pavilion west to the cemetery, removing Ardisia and Camphor Trees along the way.

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Daphne Fire Department Celebrates 20 Years

The City of Daphne Fire Department will celebrate 20 years of having paid personnel protect the citizens of the Jubilee City.

In 1988 the City of Daphne held a referendum to see if the citizens of Lake Forest, Park City, and Jacksons Oak wanted to be annexed into the city limits. The majority of the citizens in the three areas voted yes and the City nearly tripled in size with the annexation of the area.

In June 1989 the City of Daphne hired the first paid fire department employees. A. Mund Hanson was hired as the Deputy Fire Chief and Arthur C. Witherington, Jr. was hired as the Fire Inspector.

In October 1990 the first two firefighters were hired. Thomas G. Bertagnolli, Sr. and Tom Walker began their careers. These two

firefighters began working 8 hours a day 365 days of the year. In October 1993 Claude "Rusty" Jackson transferred to the fire department from the mowing department.

The fire department began manning fire station #2 on North Main Street in 1996 when additional firefighters were hired. The City of Daphne now has 36 fire department personnel manning 3 fire stations.

There are 5 administrative personnel. The Fire Chief, James "Bo" White, and Administrative Assistant Meredith McCampbell have their offices at fire station #2. The Fire Marshal, Fire Inspector, and Public Fire Life Safety Educator have offices in the Bureau of Fire Prevention located at City Hall.

The Daphne Volunteer Fire Department responds to fire calls to assist the paid personnel on larger fires and when there is need for manpower to assist other neighboring fire departments. The volunteers have training and meetings at fire station #1 on Sixth Street, behind City Hall.
