

WATER WATCH PARTNERS WITH CITY OF DAPHNE



Since their establishment in 1992, the mission of Alabama Water Watch is to improve both water quality and water policy through citizen monitoring and action. Through the use of EPA-approved monitoring plans and a community approach, Water Watch trains citizens throughout the State to monitor the conditions of their local water bodies.

The Mobile Bay National Estuary program offers Alabama Water Watch certification training for residents interested in learning how to monitor and report local water quality conditions. 

ALABAMA

D'Olive Watershed Restoration

This project proposes to restore degraded streams and install management measures to reduce the downstream impacts in the D'Olive watershed through a combination of stormwater retrofits, stream restorations and detailed monitoring. Stabilization of these stream segments will significantly reduce sediment loading in the northeast quadrant of Mobile Bay, improving the quality and clarity of the water necessary for re-establishing submerged aquatic vegetation (SAV) beds in the upper Bay. SAV beds provide critical nursery areas for important species of shellfish and finfish.

The watershed has faced excessive erosion and sedimentation since the 1970's that has dramatically reduced the extent of seagrass beds in portions of Mobile Bay. Stormwater runoff from new developments has significantly impacted watershed morphology, function, and hydrology causing stream channel instability, head-cutting, mass slumping, and wetlands degradation. Altered hydrology, loss of natural wetlands and riparian areas, and inadequate natural flood plains have negatively impacted aquatic and wildlife species' survival and habitat. This project would complement earlier restoration work and is part

of a broader restoration strategy envisioned in the 2002 Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan for the Mobile Bay Estuary. Work will include projects on three distinct tributaries of the D'Olive watershed and will significantly contribute to improved water quality and habitat creation in D'Olive and Mobile Bays.



Improvement in the highly impaired D'Olive Watershed (above) is critical to the ecological function of both D'Olive Bay and Mobile Bay. The project will significantly reduce the largest source of local sediments to Mobile Bay and improve conditions for degraded SAV beds (above-left).

In an effort to improve the City's sign regulations our City Council established a committee to assist in the process. Each Councilman appointed a citizen from his/her respective district: District 1, Elnora Jackson, District 2, Steve Robinson, District 3, Bill Burdick, District 4, Toni Fassbender, District 4, John Peterson, District 6, Victor LeJeune, and District 7, Frieda Romanchuk.

After 13 weekly meetings, with the assistance of Mayor Haygood, Adrienne Jones, Community Development Director, Patricia Johnson, Administrative Secretary, and Lonnie Jones, Code Enforcement Officer, the committee successfully submitted its recommendations to Council.

THE PLANNING COMMISSION

In addition to the **Planning Commission's** role in subdividing land and site plan review/approval for new establishments and/or major renovations to existing establishments, the Commission makes recommendations about land development policies. On November 21st, the Planning Commission held a public hearing to gather citizen input on the Sign Committee's recommendation.

Current members of the Planning Commission are Ed Kirby, Larry Chason, Don Terry, Charles Smith, Monty Montgomery. The three ex-officio members are Councilman Ron Scott, Fire Chief, James "Bo" White, and appointed to serve as the mayor's designee, Hudson Sandefur.

The Planning Commission typically meets monthly on the fourth Thursday at City Hall in the Council Chambers at 5:00 pm. There are some exceptions to the meeting days. See the City calendar for actual meeting schedule.

DRIVING

- Plan your route, leave early, and be sure to include alternate routes
- Be careful driving or walking near parades and parade routes
- Be watchful of drunk drivers

PARKING

- All normal parking regulations apply
- Observe Special Event & No Parking signs along parade route
- When parking your vehicle, take extra measures to secure personal property
- Place any items of value in your trunk
- Lock all doors

ON THE STREETS

- Open glass containers not permitted
- Do not cross barricades once the parade has started
- Children are to be accompanied by an adult at all times

- Do not throw anything at floats or riders

ISKF South Shotokan Karate

Shotokan Karate is the direct descendant of the original Japanese school and style brought to mainland Japan in 1922 by Okinawan Master Gichin Funakoshi. ISKF South is a family oriented training center that welcomes men, women, and children to train in a safe and encouraging environment. It is the U. S. Southern



Region Headquarters of the INTERNATIONAL SHOTOKAN KARATE FEDERATION (ISKF), one of the largest Shotokan Karate organizations in the world, with clubs in over 40 countries. The club is continuing the program which is in its fourteenth year at the Daphne Recreation Center. The coming year will see interested students preparing for competition in the ISKF National Championships and for attendance at ISKF Master Camp in Greenlane, Pennsylvania, outside Philadelphia.

The chief instructor, Leon Sill, is a 7th degree black belt with over 50 years of teaching and competition experience and is the ISKF Southern Region Director and Chief Instructor. He is a graduate of the ISKF Instructor Training Institute, is ranked as an international ("A" level) instructor, examiner, and judge, and is a member of the ISKF Technical Committee, which is charged with researching and maintaining ISKF's instructional and technical standards as well as the rules for competition. In addition, he is an advisor to the ISKF National Collegiate Karate Association. He is also former Shotokan consultant on the U.S.A. National Karate Federation technical committee, the

organization currently tasked with the inclusion of Karate as an Olympic sport. His martial arts background includes several ISKF regional and national individual and team championships, an Armed Forces Karate Association championship, two 1st place finishes in the American Continental Championships in Mexico City, and two top-10 finishes in the World Karate Championships in Tokyo, Japan.

Sensei Sill is assisted by Sensei Barry Rotch, 3rd degree black belt, and Sensei Randy Payne, 3rd degree black belt. Both are currently enrolled in the ISKF Instructor Training Institute and teach at ISKF South as part of their formalized training.



ISKF Shotokan Karate is a very effective way for you to learn self defense while getting in great physical shape and increasing your strength and flexibility, as Karate conditions and uses the muscles of the body in a very comprehensive, efficient way. It has also been proven that a person's discipline and self-confidence increases with the practice of the martial arts. Classes are held at the Daphne Recreation Center. We offer classes for children and adult beginners, as well as intermediate and advanced classes. Classes are divided by age group but still allow parents to participate with their children. We have several parents doing so. It is a valuable activity whether you are interested in sport competition, discipline and concentration, or just good exercise. Master Gichin Funakoshi's ultimate aim in karate was the development of the

character of its participants.







New magazine






